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## CAF PRESIDENT'S FOREWORD

The development and growth of Women's football in Africa is a top priority of CAF's current leadership. It is a commitment to the women who play the game, to the young girls who dream of a football career, and to all those who invest in the promotion and advancement of African Women's football.
CAF has made good progress over the past two years and is strongly committed to continuing its mission to make African Girls and Women's football amongst the best in the World.
In line with the "CAF 2021-2025 Action Plan", we have:

- Introduced the CAF Women's Champions League competition with a prize money of USD 1.55 million, which is an increase of $100 \%$
- Increased the prize money for the Women's African Cup of Nations from USD 975000 to USD 2.4 million, an increase of $150 \%$
- Introduced the African Schools Football Championship in which 180000 girls from different countries on the African Continent had the chance to play and compete in football at the grassroot level. This will also prepare these talented girls for the U-17 Girls Integrated Tournament ("GIFT") that we will be organizing in Zonal Unions.
- Contributed to advancing fairness and gender equality as the prize money for the winning girls' and boys' schools in the African Schools Football Championship is identical. The winning boys' and girls' schools at Continental level will each receive USD 300000 and USD 100000 for winning at Zonal level.
- Developed several programmes for Women Referees, Coaches and Administrators in collaboration with our Zonal Unions and our 54 CAF Member Associations

We are confident that African Women's football will in the medium to long term period become self-sustaining and globally competitive.

At CAF, we have dedicated significant human and financial resources to develop and improve the quality of our female players, coaches, referees, administrators and other football stakeholders
The increasing popularity of Women's football in Africa and globally is an indication of its potential and unique power to contribute to uniting people from different racial, ethnic, religious and cultural backgrounds.

We are aware that despite the significant progress that has been made, there is still a lot of work to be done to make African Women's football amongst the best in the World.

The first African Women's Football Landscape Report will also assist us in highlighting the strengths and weaknesses in Women's Football on the African Continent. This should ensure that the appropriate improvement and remedial measures are implemented in our CAF Member Associations.
The future of Girls and Women's football on the African Continent is bright.

## INTRODUCTION

The Confederation of African Football (CAF) is committed to the development and professionalization of women's football throughout Africa. As part of our Women's Football Strategy, which was launched in 2020, implementing sustainable women's football development programs is a top priority, and the compilation and sharing of knowledge is a valuable tool for CAF and our MAs to achieve this objective.

This inaugural CAF Women's Football Landscape Report collected information from our Member Associations (MAs) for 3 key areas:

DEVELOPMENT & PARTICIPATION - LEAGUES & COMPETITIONS - STRUCTURE & GOVERNANCE
```

An online survey was developed and distributed to all 54 Member Associations, with 52 completing the survey. These survey responses, in addition to historic competition participation information per FIFA and CAF archives, were analyzed and used to formulate the key findings and MA profiles.

The report provides a holistic view of women's football in CAF today, as well as outlines specific information for each MA that can be used to benchmark current status. As we continue to design and implement women's football initiatives throughout the continent, this data will be utilized to measure and evaluate progress for years to come

We look forward to continuing to collaborate with our MAs as we strive to elevate women's football to new heights.

## FEMALE PLAYERS

CAF Member Associations reported a total of 150,653 registered female players. Players 20 and below account for $62 \%$ of these players, and players 21 and above account for $38 \%$.

The median number of registered players per MA is 1,025 , and the average is 2,897 .

Twenty-six (26) MAs have more than 1,000 registered female players, and 3 MAs have more than 10,000.

## FEMALE COACHES

There are 4,140 female coaches registered at CAF MAs. $83 \%$ of female coaches are ages 39 and below, while $17 \%$ are 40 and above.

The median number of female coaches per MA is 24 , and the average is 81 . Nine (9) Member Associations have more than 100 registered female coaches.

On average, MAs have 13 coaches with a CAF C Licence, 8 coaches with a CAF B Licence and 3 coaches with a CAF A Licence.

## GIRLS' GRASSROOTS

Grassroots programs can be an important component of women's football development efforts. Thirty-seven (37) CAF MAs currently have an active girls' grassroots program.


Grassroots festivals are organized in 32 of the 37 MAs with an active girls' grassroots program.

Member Associations organize festivals in 25 MAs.

- Regional / Provincial / Zonal Associations organize festivals in 12 MAs.

A total of 336 girls' grassroots festivals were organized

- by CAF MAs in 2021, with an average of 12.9 festivals in each MA.


## SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS

CAF MAs are also partnering with schools to teach football and encourage girls' participation in the game.


## REGIONAL / ZONAL STRUCTURE

The majority of CAF MAs (32) have a regional / zonal structure for women's football development.

## WOMEN'S TOP DIVISION COMPETITION

The majority of these (38) are national competitions, with teams throughout the country competing to determine the national champions. Eleven (11) competitions are regional / zonal / provincial, with teams organized by geography and competing to determine a regional / provisional / zonal champion. Of these 11 regional competitions, 8 conclude with a national final.

## COMPETITION ELEMENTS IN PLACE

CAF MAs provided insights on specific competition elements in place. The average number of elements in place was 5 , with 2 competitions having all 11 items in place.

When asked to categorize the current status of its top division competition, $67 \%$ of MAs (31) indicated amateur, $24 \%$ (11) indicated semi-professional and $9 \%$ (4) indicated professional.

In 7 CAF MAs, one or more sponsors provide support specifically for women's football.

A total of 13 sponsors provide this support, with amounts ranging from $3 \%$ to 100\% of the annual women's football budget.

CAF MAs are receiving government support for women's football.
On average, for MAs that receive government support, this support accounts for $20.7 \%$ of the women's football budget. Government support ranges from 5\% to 50\% of an MA's women's football budget
